THE NEED FOR COMPREHENSIVE TRAINING

This comprehensive training program is a strategic effort to strengthen the capacity of policymakers, local authorities, and practitioners across Eastern Africa to address climate-induced migration. As one of the activities of the MECMEA Project, financed by the European Union and contracted by ICMPD to promote evidence-based policy advocacy, the training was organized to encourage regional collaboration, cross-sector engagement, and the provision of practical tools to support effective policy development, review, and implementation.

It further builds networks and promotes continuous knowledge sharing among stakeholders, strengthening collective responses to emerging migration challenges. Using resources such as the "Making Migration Work for Africa" manual, the training supports the integration of migration into broader development strategies in line with Agenda 2063 and AU migration frameworks.

The training aims to foster more coherent migration management by deepening understanding of the influence of environmental challenges, climate change, and conflict on migration and human mobility, as well as by strengthening governance systems and approaches. Ultimately, it equips stakeholders with the knowledge and networks needed to turn migration into a driver of development, social cohesion, and stability in Eastern Africa.

- Enhance participants' understanding of migration characteristics, patterns, drivers, trends, and the migration-environment-development nexus.
- Highlight the importance of establishing robust migration governance systems to make migration work for Africa.

- Empower participants to leverage migration for national, regional, and continental development, supporting Agenda 2063 and the African migration agenda.
